I work to identify problem areas within my neighborhood and initiate problem-solving activities through alley clean ups, call in of 311 problems and organization of neighborhood cookouts which connect neighbors with city departments and officials and with one another.

What North Linden issue most concerns you most and how do you believe you can personally be involved to find a solution.

- Develops a sense of community where neighbors help neighbors (especially the elderly who may need additional help). Also can provide an opportunity to engage young people in this endeavor. They learn a sense of 'giving back' and pride in developing their own sense of community.

 Gets cleanouts off the streets faster and not be allowed to blow around or fester and get moldy or bring rodents.

How can I contribute:

- Engage others in Litter Surveys of their streets
- Participate/organize in block/alley cleanups (have already done this several times in our neighborhood)
- Work with Keep Columbus Beautiful to provide useful resources to residents. Do annual clean up day with Kick Butt Columbus
- Educate home owners as to city codes regarding parking of cars, commercial vehicles, maintenance of property, height of grass, maintenance of alleyways (half way to mid line).
- Participate in Rock the Block activities with Habitat for Humanity.
- I am still able to cut brush, run a lawn mower, use the pruners, and pick up trash for the
 betterment of North Linden. I will personally engage in these endeavors over my time in
 office and have done these things continually during my time that I have lived in North
 Linden. I frequently work to keep the circles clean and tidy of trash and weeds.
- I will take any opportunity to educate homeowners as to their responsibilities towards maintaining their property in a safe, clean and compliant manner. And I will actively do my part to clean up the area and park where I live.

We only have one earth and one opportunity to keep it clean – I rode my bike in the first Earth Day and will continue to work towards maintaining a healthy climate and a tidy neighborhood to my elder years.
